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Miss McBye. Her designation: Director, K9 Squad, Lemon Tree Hotels. Or at least that's what her visiting card would've said — if she carried one. Instead, what she has is a ring and a whistle that can charm the pants off all the George Clooneys in the world. Brie is a golden Labrador pup who lives in the Lemon Tree Hotel in Electronic City. She was adopted ten-and-a-half years ago, when the hotel's General Manager, Mahesh Verma, was returning from a resort and found her abandoned on the road. Brie is now an integral part of the hotel and a member of the K9 Squad — that's what the hotel's dogs are called.

At the other end of the city, is Snuggles aka East Tree, a black and white pup, which resides at group's third hotel, Ushaiq Lake. Not surprisingly, her name reflects her attitude and Snuggles, we are told, loves to cuddle.

At their third outlet in the city, in Whitefield, is Mr. Geek, a tan-and-white Customer Analytics Specialist. According to the hotel staff, this "genius boy" is known to be observant, analytical and interprets data. "He excels in collecting information about our guests and helps the team deliver customer delight. He loves to meet and interact with people. You will always find him wagging his tail at the sight of friendly faces and who-

better to let us know about guests than him," says Aradhana Lal, Vice President, Corporate Communications & Sustainability Initiatives, The Lemon Tree Hotel Company. Lal also gives us a tip — Geek can be won over with a good hammy gift. Geek was an abandoned three-month-old pup when he came to live at the hotel.

Let's unattend, these may need to be fed or themselves on the city's streets scavenging for food and shelter like thousands of their counterparts. But a Pooch Policy came to their rescue.

Lemon Tree Hotels' Pooch Policy was initiated by the group's founder, Ruta Kevalani, himself a dog lover.

Under this policy, all 27 hotels of the group across 16 cities have adopted a stray. The adopted strays are named, trained, fed and get their daily dose of exercise. They are fed three to four times a day, which includes a diet of milk and dog food as well as vegetarian and non-vegetarian meals. Since Brie is a baby, she is fed Cesar and boned meat.

The dogs are taken care of by a security personnel who also walk the dogs at least four times a day. Through there is a dog shelter built within the

hotel premises, the dogs are free to pick their favorite spots. Geek, for instance, can often be found — resting — in the back office or on the couch in the GM's office.

Each member of the K9 squad follows a daily schedule — which mostly involves, eating, walking, sleeping, playing, cleaning up, being petted and day-dreaming — that's strictly adhered to. Although no specific budget has been set aside for their upkeep, around Rs 200 a day is spent on the dogs.

The staff and sometimes, hotel guests, enjoy playing with the dogs too. Guests, who are dog lovers, are very happy to see the dogs and enjoy playing with them. Dogs are Man's best friend, I suppose.

The Pooch Policy came into play since 12 years ago, when their first hotel in Udyog Vihar, Gurgaon, adopted a stray, Sparky, the first stray dog to be adopted, was picked up by Ruta Kevalani's son Aditya at a

park in Delhi in 2002 (incidentally, it's the year Lemon Tree was founded). The pup was kept in the office in an empty computer box lined with old clothes, before running into the house kept just for him. Sparky went on to become a mascot of sorts for the hotel.

Sparky Kevalani is now the vice-chairman and senior hotel critic of Lemon Tree Hotels. Lal says, Sparky embodies their "values of business, fun and spirited energy".

Since Sparky is the nickname in the K9 Squad, she has an instant apprentice — Aditya's 10-year-old Kevalani Street Artist, a canine equivalent to the vice-chairdog. This amutinous fawn, black, brown and white male pup definitely has "some Geekie blood in him".

"The dogs represent fun, work, fun and play (at work) and a lot for life," Lal says. The K9 Squad repeats in agreement. Interestingly, Lemon Tree Hotel has no pet policy for guests.
